

Despite the positive progress made in the media landscape to promote and increase the visibility of our Sports, we face crucial challenges, emphasized by the COVID-19 pandemic, which need to be tackled.

Success is the only possible outcome to strengthen our future in the Olympic arena among the international winter sports federations.

The main goals remain our capacity to secure a strong position in the broadcasting schedules (live or replay) within the European markets, to make progress in the North American territories and to develop our presence in key Asian countries such as China, South Korea, Japan. In parallel, it is crucial to develop our digital presence throughout the scope of available platforms in order to appeal to new audiences through an elaborated and segmented approach based on the specificities of each discipline.

Our marketing and media partner must and will play a key role in the implementation of this strategy, the health crisis having highlighted the importance and the opportunities offered by the digital world.



At the IBSF YouTube channel, which provides a live streaming service of the World Cup and World Championships and in addition to that, highlight videos, interviews, stories of athletes, behind the scenes content and much more, we could achieve a plus of subscribers of more than 2,000 and nearly 875,000 views. We can see a similar development on the social media platform Facebook and Instagram.

Another positive development is the last season opened IBSF Flickr account. We were able to upload 15.926 professional photos from the World Cup, World Championships as well as Para Sport World Cup and Para Sport World Championships. The IBSF Flickr account gives people the chance to see the fascination of the Bobsleigh and Skeleton sport through inspiring shots from all around the world. Additionally, the National Federations and our Race Organizers use these pictures for own accounts. It's great to see that the introduction of this social media channel was a great success and is accepted with great enthusiasm. The uploaded photos have been viewed almost 2 million times!

It is particularly nice to see, that our official IBSF website is still very well received and well frequented. Nevertheless, we also tried to develop our website and created a new category named "Inside IBSF". This innovation was introduced to give people the chance to see what happens inside of an International Federation, what measures are taken in relation to various matters, what type of support is offered and many more. We can register a growth of 359.137 new users and around 3,5 million views on our website. In addition to our continuously updated website, we provided 126 press releases during the season 2019/2020, 71 of these dealt with World Cup and World Championships.

5. ATHLETES COMMITTEE

Unfortunately, an insufficient number of athletes were available to run for the first ballot of the Athletes' Advisory Committee elections in the previous season. Except for the Women's Skeleton representative, all positions remained vacant at that time. In the following season new elections were held, and now all Committee positions are filled since December 2019.

Especially the topic of mental health has been discussed more frequently because the mental health of the athletes is an ever-present topic in everyday life of athletes. Last winter, the IBSF held its first workshop on mental health during the World Cup in Königssee. Information and further training in this field is to be continued and, at best, intensified.

An improvement in the safety of Skeleton athletes can be expected thanks to the first certified skeleton helmet, which will be launched on the market in October. Moreover, the new standard Monobob for women will be introduced together with a specific race series in which NAC, EC and WC athletes will be ranked. The reaction start for the Skeleton team competition will be further tested and hopefully this format will be applied for the competition soon.



6. LEGAL & ANTI-DOPING

New IBSF Anti-Doping Rules

In March 2020 we updated the current rules to reflect the collaboration with the International Testing Agency (ITA) and the Court of Arbitration for Sport Anti-Doping Division (CAS ADD). At the same time, we have revised the IBSF Anti-Doping Rules in full following the approval of the new World Anti-Doping Authority Code (“WADA Code”) in November 2019. The IBSF as a signatory of the WADA Code is obliged to incorporate the new rules into its own regulations, which has been done through the new IBSF Anti-Doping Rules.

The new IBSF Anti-Doping Rules have been approved by the WADA as well as by the IBSF Executive Committee and will coming into effect January 1st 2021. They are based on the WADA Model Rules for International Federations which reflect the WADA Code and its related standards.

Transition to the International Testing Agency (ITA)

Last summer, the Executive Committee decided to move most of the Anti-Doping program to the International Testing Agency (ITA) and since March 2020 the IBSF has assigned its Anti-Doping duties to them. In general, it can be said that there exists a very good cooperation between the IBSF and the ITA so far.

The Anti-Doping Education still remains in the remit of the IBSF. The focus regarding the Anti-Doping Education in the previous season was clearly on the youth sector and we were able to record an enormous positive development in this area due to the numerous different educational programs that we've offered.

LIMS Data

In the end of April 2020 the Investigations & Intelligence (I&I) Department of the WADA provided 27 International Sports Federations (IBSF being amongst them) with new information from the Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) data of the Moscow Anti-Doping Centre (Moscow Laboratory), following WADA’s I&I teams successful retrieval of a copy of the Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS), associated raw data and samples from the former Moscow Laboratory in January and April 2019. WADA has been compiling this information in evidence packages in respect to individual cases. The IBSF received a data package by WADA and since then is working closely with laboratory and legal experts to investigate whether to pursue Anti-Doping Rule Violations (ADRVs) against any of the athletes. The data analysis and investigation are very complex, the IBSF investigation is still in progress and it is being decided on a case by case basis whether they can be brought forward as an Anti-Doping Violation (ADRV) or not, the WADA being fully involved in the whole process.



Ethics Committee

There were no cases brought forward to the IBSF Ethics Committee in 2019/2020.

7. SPORT

Participation

In the season 2019/2020 we saw increases in the number of nations competing in all IBSF Olympic disciplines compared to the previous season.

Participation numbers for athletes were mixed. We saw increases in athlete participation in Men's and Women's Skeleton, 2-women Bobsleigh and 4-man Bobsleigh compared to the previous season, as well as a small decrease in participation in 2-man Bobsleigh compared to the previous season.

The goal of the IBSF is to grow participation of nations and athletes, so we will continue to monitor the participation numbers to see if they represent natural fluctuations or trends that require increased attention.

Para Bobsleigh

During the 2019/2020 season, 26 athletes from 16 nations and 4 continents were ranked in 10 Para Bobsleigh World Cup races at 5 different venues. Despite not being on Paralympics Games programme, almost all athletes from previous seasons continue to slide and are committed to strengthen and grow our sport. Additionally, we had 8 new athletes competing this season.

Youth Olympic Games

The 2020 Youth Olympic Games in St. Moritz, Switzerland was successful and showed great promise for the future. We noted 14 nations participated in men's and women's skeleton, 18 nations competed in men's Monobob, and 15 nations competed in women's Monobob.

8. DEVELOPMENT

Development program

In the season 2019/2020, the IBSF Development Program contains more than 38 supported skeleton athletes with an average age of 24 years and another 47 supported bobsleigh athletes with an average age of 23 years. Altogether, 85 athletes participated in the Development Program of the season 2019/2020.

The number of participants in the individual programs offered by the Development Program still vary partially. All in all, it can be said that we have definitely achieved a movement in the right and positive direction regarding the participation numbers in the past season.



Because of our targeted programs, we were able to contribute a big part to the path of positive development and performance optimization in cooperation with the federations and the athletes. Based on the results it can be noted, that the Development Program has proven successful and is bearing its first fruits.

Women's Monobob Program

We are now in the second year after the introduction of the new discipline Women's Monobob and we can definitely look back on a satisfactory time. During the past season we have succeeded to expand the Women's Monobob Program up to eight different events. Four of them were held in Europe and the other four in North America. Unfortunately, the last event in Lake Placid/USA had to be cancelled due to the protective measures related to COVID-19. In addition to that, we were able to offer training camps and bobsleigh schools for beginners and career changers.

To mention only a few figures in that context, the number of participants compared to the last season has increased by 10 % up to a total of 51 athletes. Additionally, we can register an increase by the participating nations of more than 30 % up to a total of 24 nations.

Youth Program

This season was dominated by our young athletes and the qualification for the Youth Olympic Games Lausanne 2020, which were held from January 9th to January 22nd in Lausanne/Switzerland, whereby Bobsleigh and Skeleton took place in St. Moritz/Switzerland. At four different destinations, on two continents, eight qualification races were held in each discipline. Two additional training days were offered right before the start of the Youth Olympic Games. Almost every Nation used this "extra training" to prepare their athletes in the best possible way. At the Youth Olympic Games 2020, we were able to experience exciting competitions at a very good level in all disciplines.

Following the successful Youth Olympic Winter Games in Lausanne/Switzerland (Bobsleigh and Skeleton in St. Moritz) the athletes of our 2019/2020 youth program are integrated into the Development Program for the upcoming season 2020/2021. To prepare our young athletes optimally for the Youth Olympic Winter Games 2024 in PyeongChang/Korea, we are planning to reactivate the Youth Program for the 2021/2022 season.





9. FISCAL

The financial year 2019/2020 therefore shows the following figures in comparison of budget to income/expenditures:

The budget increase is mainly due to the fact that revenues and costs for the TV production have been planned as gross amounts for the first time in the 2019/2020 budget year.

Besides the tax payment in Lausanne, overruns are mainly referred to two cost centers:

1. **30272 Social Insurance:** Up to now, the social insurance payments settled via FIBT Marketing GmbH were shown as a lump sum under item 30720. With the closure of FIBT Marketing GmbH, these can now be shown separately via 30272. In addition, the costs for the two new appointments from 2018/19, Skeleton and Development, will be incurred all year round in the 2019/20 financial year.
2. **62000 Public Work:** In the area of public work, we were able to reduce the costs from the previous year from €526,000 to €393,000, however the budget of €200,000 could not be adhered to, as more measures have been taken in the social media area, that also being reflected in the successful social Media data.

Despite numerous negotiations, we did not succeed in finding a successor for our former sponsor Gazprom in the 2018/2019 and 2019/2020 budget years. Since the income from this contract was largely passed on to the organizers of World Cup races and we continued to pay the organizers the pro rata income from the Gazprom contract, the IBSF incurred a total loss of about 1.4 million €. Starting from the following budget year 2020/2021 we may count on a two-year cooperation with China, which, thanks to the initiative of our President Ivo Ferriani, has already resulted in a binding Letter of Intent and will soon lead to the signing of a corresponding contract. Together with the revenues involved, the financing of the pre-Olympic season and the Olympic season is also covered by the IBSF's assets. In return, we have agreed with the Chinese partners on a corresponding marketing campaign for our sport in China, which will be financed by the IBSF.

The 2020/2021 budget year will not be an easy one. We have tried to plan the budget as well as possible in compliance with the requirements dictated by the Covid-19 pandemic. The necessary hygiene concept for all race series alone will probably cost 650,000 €. Nobody can say right now, in October 2020, what restrictions and demands will occur in the coming months.

Report of the Audit Committee to the Members of the International Bobsleigh and Skeleton Federation (IBSF) on the Independent Auditors' full audit of IBSF's Financial Statements for the years ended March 31, 2020 and 2019

In the execution of the mandate by the 2019 Congress, the IBSF's Executive Committee with the recommendation of the Audit Committee, engaged KPMG SA to perform a full audit of IBSF's financial statements for the years ended March 31, 2020 and 2019. KPMG's opinions of the audit expressed that the financial statements for both years comply with Swiss Law.

In accordance with article 12.5 of IBSF's Statutes, the Audit Committee reviewed and discussed the results of the Full Audit with representatives of KPMG SA and Andreas Trautvetter, IBSF's Vice President of Corporate and Financial Affairs. Based on KPMG's opinions, we recommend the Congress to approve the financial statements of both years and release the Executive Committee members and the Secretary General.

Report of the Independent Auditor to the Executive Committee on the Financial Statements of International Bobsleigh & Skeleton Federation (IBSF), Lausanne

As independent auditor, we have been engaged to audit the accompanying financial statements of International Bobsleigh & Skeleton Federation (IBSF), which comprise the balance sheet, income statement and notes for the year ended 31 March 2020.

Vice President of Corporate and Financial Affairs' Responsibility

The Vice President of Corporate and Financial Affairs is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the requirements of Swiss law. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining an internal control system relevant to the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. The Vice President of Corporate and Financial Affairs is further responsible for selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Swiss Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers the internal control system relevant to the entity's preparation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the existence and effectiveness of the entity's internal control system. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.
