



International Women's Monobob Rules World Championships 2021 Lake Placid (USA)

With the exception of the regulations explicitly listed in this document, all regulations of the current International Bobsleigh Rules apply equally to the Women's Monobob Rules.

Qualification for the Women's Monobob World Championships 2021

- For the 5 IBSF races in the last 24 months before the World Championships, or 3 IBSF races in the current season, which are required according to the general Bobsleigh Rules, article 4.2.1, "Requirements for participation in the Senior World Championships", both the two-woman bob results and the Women's Monobob results of a pilot will be taken into account.
- Quotas are based on the current IBSF Women's Monobob discipline ranking. The number of races counted is in any case identical to the number of races of the "Women's Monobob World Series" hitherto carried out in the course of the World Cup race series. A maximum of the four best results of each pilot will be taken into consideration.
- The quotas for participation in the Senior World Championships are as follows:
 - 4 nations with 2 starting places and
 - 12 nations with 1 starting place each

Participation in the Women's Monobob World Championships 2021

General aspects

- Liability: The athletes must sign an IBSF waiver (release of liability) prior to the runs as well as a track-specific waiver, which must be submitted to the IBSF World Cup Coordinator before the first team captains' meeting. For athletes under the age of 18, these waivers must be signed by a parent/guardian.
- The entry fees belong to the race organizer and amount to € 20.00 per athlete.
- The rental fee per sled amounts to € 750,-- and has to be paid to the IBSF by bank wire transfer in any case before the beginning of the first team captains' meeting.
- No IBSF points will be awarded for this race.

Bob/Runners

Only Monobobs provided by the IBSF will be used:

- 10 IBSF Monobobs
 - 4 ORDA Monobobs
 - 5 USABS Monobobs and
 - 1 BRA Monobob
- The runners are not provided by the IBSF, whereby only the use of tested two-man bob runners is permitted.

Weight

- **Minimum Weight:**
Sled including the runners and without the pilot
 - Monobob **175 kg**
- **Maximum Weight:**
Sled including the pilot, the runners and the other equipment:
 - Monobob **260 kg**

Draw and allocation of the sleds

- On the occasion of the first team captains' meeting, a draw will be held to assign the sleds to the athletes.
- This draw will be made according to the IBSF Women's Monobob discipline ranking list.
Example: The best placed pilot or her team captain draws a sled number, followed by the second placed pilot and so on.

Preparation of the equipment

- The sled must be left in its original condition.
- Any modification of the sled, including the affixing of tape, stickers or graphics, is prohibited or is subject to approval by the Jury.
